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About The Ohio Theatre

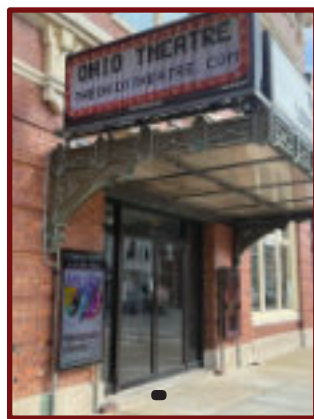
For more than a century, The Ohio Theatre has stood at the heart of Loudonville as a gathering place for arts, entertainment, and community. Built in 1909 and opened on December 27, 1910, the building originally served as the village's municipal hall, fire station, and the Loudonville Opera House. In 1931, it became known as The Ohio Theatre, beginning its long life as a home for movies, live performances, and community events.

Today, the theatre remains a beautifully preserved historic landmark where —listed on the National Register of Historic Places—



and continues to welcome audiences of all ages. Its stage hosts live theatre, first-run films, concerts, youth arts education, and special events, all supported by dedicated volunteers and the Loudonville Theatre & Arts Committee (LTAC).

More than just a venue, The Ohio Theatre is a cultural cornerstone for the Mohican region. Its mission is to preserve this historic space while offering programs that inspire creativity, enrich community life, and celebrate the performing arts. As it has for over a century, the theatre continues to bring people together under one roof—where history, imagination, and community spirit shine on.

We imagine a community where the arts are valued, local talent is celebrated, and everyone feels welcome to participate. MCT is committed to building that future

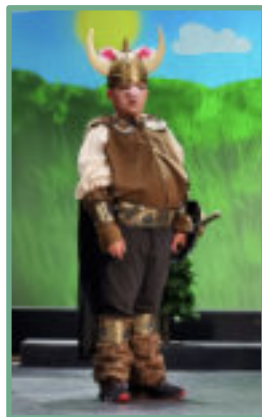
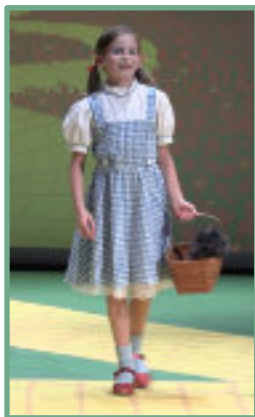

Matt Kindle (Steve & Mean One)

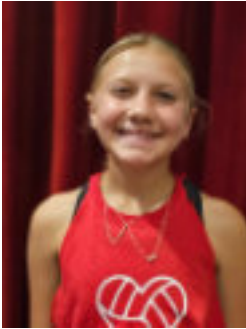

Ella Murray (Hairbrush)

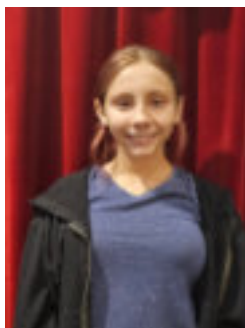

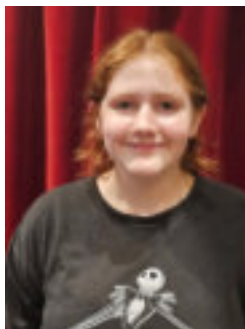
Lucy Pollard (Lazy)

Kristie Ferreira (Director, Set Design)

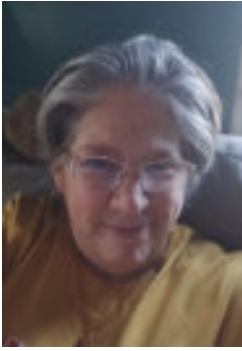

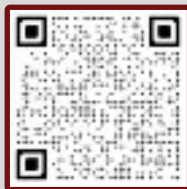

Nestled in the heart of Mohican, the historic Loudonville Opera House was built as the municipal hall, fire station and opera house in 1909. It continues to house the village offices, council chamber, and police department as well as the 400 seat theatre which became known as The Ohio Theatre in 1931.

This property is listed on the National Register of Historic Places by the Department of the Interior.
